These courses will give new leaders and leaders changing positions the knowledge and skills needed to be successful and provide a working knowledge of Pack, Den, Troop and Crew management. Prior to completing Leader Specific Training and to be eligible to wear the TRAINED patch on the Unit uniform, each leader must also complete Youth Protection Training (See <http://scouting.org/Training.aspx>).

BASIC LEADER TRAINING

Youth Protection training is designed to help you keep our youth safe from abuse. You will learn the Boy Scouts of America's Youth Protection Guidelines, signs of abuse, and how to report suspected abuse. This course must be completed to earn the "Trained" emblem for any Scouting Leader Position.

Cub Scout Leader Specific Training

This course will give new leaders the basic knowledge and skills needed to support a pack and conduct a successful pack program. The purpose of the Cub Scout Leader Specific Training is to familiarize Den Leaders, Cubmasters and Pack Committee members with the various responsibilities of the individual leaders as well as the committee as a whole. The goal is to help each pack leader work as a team to improve the Scouting experience for adult and youth members.

Venturing Leader Specific Training

This training is designed to introduce adult Venturing Crew leaders to the basic information needed to manage a Crew. The course includes the 2014 updates to Venturing and aligns with the new Venturing leader materials. Participants will discuss the roles and responsibilities of a Venturing Crew Committee and how to keep positively engaged in the functions of a successful Crew.

Scoutmaster Specific Training

The purpose of Scoutmaster Position-Specific training is to provide an active, fun, and positive learning experience for new and experienced Scoutmasters and Committee members to learn and apply proven techniques for running an effective Boy Scout troop. Scoutmasters will learn how to meet the aims of Scouting by applying the eight methods of the Boy Scouting program during the four main sessions of the course: Patrol Method, Support Team, Advancement and Annual Planning. This course must be completed along with Youth Protection and IOLS to earn the "Trained" emblem for Scoutmaster or Assistant Scoutmaster.
