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Dear Scouts and Scout Leaders:

On behalf of the Boy Scouts of America, Long Beach Area Council, the 2017 Spring Camporee Committee would like to welcome all troops, crews, posts, ships, interested parents and all unit leaders to the **2017 Spring Camporee** hosted by the Los Fierros District, LBAC. **CYCLE de MAYO** will take place at the **Santa Fe Dam Recreation Area** on the **weekend of May 5-7, 2017**. (Thank you in advance for any assistance from any Polaris District leaders.) This **unit participation guide** is written to answer most of your questions concerning this camporee in preparation for a fun and active weekend.

You might ask, “What is a camporee?” Well, it is many things— a gathering of troops showing patriotism saluting the American flag, the patter of rain on a tent in the middle of the night, a coyote howling at the moon, the smell of bacon cooking in the morning mist, the cheering of boys during a patrol competition, laughter during a skit at the campfire, leadership in action, or one more advancement completed towards rank or merit badge.

The camporee theme **Cycle De Mayo** is based around some of the requirements of the Cycling Merit Badge and scout skills demonstrated on the fun adventure to First Class. This is the chance for youth to show leadership, teamwork and talent. Some of Saturday’s exciting Boy Scout events will be:

- Bicycle Assembly Game
- Canoe Race
- Life Line Ring Toss (knots)
- Kim’s Game / Bicycle Parts & Accessories
- Bike Trail Compass Course
- Injured Biker First Aid
- Pony Express Pizza Delivery

Scout troops are welcome to ride their bicycles from Long Beach up the San Gabriel River Bike Path or Los Angeles River Bike Path to the Santa Fe Dam. Units should plan on working toward the Cycling Merit Badge ahead of time so they can get the most fun out of the camporee. High Adventure Scouting demands safety first, so don’t forget your helmet, safety gear, first aid kit and water bottle. Make sure to have your important “chase crew” and emergency contact person available during your ride. **Any Unit or Patrol riding to the camporee will be acknowledged at CYCLE de MAYO Camporee Campfire!**

As these events get underway, we need more help from unit leaders, parents and senior youth in running activities. **We need each troop to provide an adult to sign up for about an hour to watch over the camping areas, due to the general public wandering nearby.** We ask that you please assist with our Saturday activities and volunteer some of your time to help the Long Beach Camporee Committee to make this weekend a success. Another reason we ask for adult and crew volunteers, is so those running an event can take a break and they can enjoy watching some of the events as well.

Please review this guide closely for information on activities, times, safety rules, and requirements. Some events may be subject to change depending on resources available. We hope you will have a fun and exciting weekend. Camporee will take place rain or shine. Patrols may sign up for the campfire program. However, any talent act will need to be pre-approved by staff.

The **COST** which includes use of the facilities, the lake, camporee patches etc. is outlined as follows:

From Long Beach, take 605 Freeway North for about 25 miles to Live Oak Ave. toward Irwindale, Exit 25, Go East on Live Oak (turns into Arrow Hwy), for about 2 miles, to Azusa Canyon Rd. Turn left on Azusa Canyon Rd and drive about $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile to the Camporee parking lot (towards the South East end of the lake). Watch for Long Beach Camporee signs for **Parking Lot 1** or Parking Lot 2 if #1 is full.

(Note: There is also a Renaissance Faire this weekend on the Southwest corner of the lake, if you see cars driving beyond the camporee. DO NOT park there.)

All Boy Scout activities are between the canoe boat dock area and parking lot 1. Do not go west of this area due to the Renaissance Faire also being held on the same days as Camporee. Note that no swimming is allowed in the beach area, since it won't be open yet. Camping areas will be assigned upon arrival, based on the size of the troop.

Parking before 6pm on Friday is \$10. **Between 6pm and 8pm is free parking through the main gate – highly recommended.** Be aware that the sheriff locks the gate at 8pm. We will have a key to the back gate for emergency. Please contact Maria Guerra at (408)206-6735.

REGISTRATION

Please Register and Make Payments as Early as possible on CampMaster or at the Scout Shop, but no later than 6:00 pm, Friday, April 28th at the Long Beach Area Council Scout Shop. Final Payment and Final Rosters need to be handed in at this time. Roster forms are located in this guide. These activities have limited space of 300 scouts, and Scouts will be put on the roster on a “**first signed up, first on the roster**” basis. Maximum numbers for camporee are 400 total which includes both boys and parents. Troops must be paid in full by April 28th, or those spaces will be given to Scouts on the waiting lists.

CYCLING TO/FROM CAMPOREE

Proper supervision of “two-deep” leadership is necessary at all times, especially if riding bicycles to and from this event. If you do ride a bike there, be sure to check your bikes for proper operation and have an adequate headlight / taillight system for your safety. Also bring necessary bike locks and chains since we are in a public park. Homeless people live nearby, so always secure your valuables. Here is a link to bike riding trails using the flood canal. Always check for weather conditions which might impact your ride. Always have an appropriate emergency first aid kit, repair equipment, and contact person for emergencies.

ADULT LEADERS / SPLs– WE NEED HELP!

It takes many adult leaders and great Senior Patrol Leaders or Ventureto make a successful event of the size and magnitude of this. We will not be able to have all of the competitions for the Scouts without your help. Please sign up some of your adults to help watch over the campsites and cooking areas for one hour.

We ask that each unit provide at least one (more if possible) adult leader to help the Staff, mostly with the events and cooking competitions on Saturday. All Staff and Unit Leaders should attend the Friday Night Adult/SPL Cracker Barrel to get further information and final arrangements. **All Events will be explained at this time.**

At night, it is suggested to store food and equipment in cars due to homeless people and animals not far from of our camping area.

Always follow the scout motto “**BE PREPARED**” – Weather changes unexpectedly.

CAMPOREE POLICY ON ALCOHOL, DRUGS, TOBACCO, & PROFANITY

The Camporee Committee supports the policy of the Boy Scouts of America concerning the use of alcoholic beverages, drugs, or other mind altering substances. It is the policy of the Camporee Committee that there shall be no alcoholic beverages, drugs or other controlled substances present at or consumed during the Camporee. Tobacco or E-Cigarettes used by adults must be used with discretion and far away from boys and camporee campsites. Non-compliance with this policy will result in the individuals or/and their unit being asked to leave the camporee. Likewise, profane language or gestures by boys or adults will not be tolerated. A SCOUT IS CLEAN.

ANIMALS

There are a variety of animals in the area. Among these are rattlesnakes, ground squirrels, raccoons, mice, coyotes, mountain lions, and a variety of birds. These have been known to arrive at the campsites without announcement. Since we will be sharing their habitat, please respect their space and **DO NOT ANTAGONIZE THEM!** If you see an animal in the area of our campsites, please notify our staff, so that we can take precautions. Because of animals, no food should be left unattended in any campsites and never in tents.

MEALS / WATER

All units will provide their own food and beverages from Friday through Sunday. Please post all Patrol Duty Rosters and Menus on Patrol Boxes at the Patrol Kitchen. All boys should carry their **own reusable water bottles** to all events if possible, so they can drink plenty of water. Patrols will be encouraged to hydrate at all events.

FIRE SAFETY

Propane or butane stoves or/and lanterns are allowed. No liquid gas stoves are allowed. Charcoal is allowed at the communal park barbecues near some of the cement area "picnic" tables, If those are in use by another unit, make sure all charcoal fires are in a contained area at least a foot off the ground and will not burn the grass. All coals must be disposed of properly and NOT in the trash. No open flame type light (candles, propane, etc.) will be allowed in any or near any tent. **Flashlight and battery lanterns are recommended.**

PARKING

There are 2 major parking areas, **Lot 1 (closest)** and **Lot 2**. Parking is LIMITED, so PLEASE carpool when possible. This is a tent camping, scouting event! Do not park past the boat dock area parking lot since other events are using those areas. **Vehicles must be parked in designated lots, and not on or driven on the grass.** At night, it is suggested to store food and equipment in cars due to homeless people within a mile of our camping area. Make sure all personal belongings are labeled and taken back to Long Beach on Sunday.

TRASH / LEAVE-NO-TRACE

As always, **LEAVE-NO-TRACE** principles apply. If you see any litter, please pick it up and place it in the proper trash receptacles. All units should make sure all campsites, parking lots, event areas, and adjacent areas are **clean**.



FIRST AID

First Aid will be available on a 24-hour basis near Staff area. At the Life Guard Station there is also First Aid. All units are encouraged to have adequate first aid supplies with them as part of their unit equipment. Be sure to bring medicines for springtime allergies as well as personal medications such as Epi-pens and nasal inhalers. Each unit needs to be aware of and facilitate with any scouts or adults with special needs. A local hospital is Greater El Monte Community Hospital 1701 Santa Anita Ave. So. El Monte. (626) 579-7777

HEALTH AND CLEANLINESS

To adhere to the scout law – “A SCOUT IS CLEAN”, use the following dish-washing method: Use a paper towel to wipe food solids from plates and pots into a trash bag. Wash all dishes in a troop wash basin with biodegradable soap (please do not wash at the hose bib). Pour used dish water in the designated “grey water can” near your campsite, and if any solids remain in the wash basin, please dump that garbage into your trash bag. We hope to leave nature as we found it. Do not throw garbage, trash or paper towels in the porta-potties (KYBOs). Facilities marked “WOMEN” are strictly for women only. Please help us keep the facilities clean and sanitary. Men and boys, please lift the toilet seat to urinate. Close the cover when leaving a KYBO to minimize the bad odors near camp.

MEDICAL FORMS

Unit Leaders should carry copies of all completed forms for their youth. Unit Leaders should also have copies of the Scouts **current Medical Forms A & B** in case of emergency. Please have forms available for inspection at time of registration.

DISCIPLINE

Adult Scouters, Senior Patrol Leaders and Patrol Leaders are responsible for the supervision of their units AT ALL TIMES and will be held accountable for their behavior.

A SCOUT IS COURTEOUS AND OBEDIENT!

OFF LIMITS - OUT OF BOUNDS

- Anywhere west of canoe area near Renaissance Faire
- No entry into the lake water, unless participating in the canoeing event.
- Fitness area nearby is off limits to under 14 years of age. Please help us monitor this.
- Cycling Units must always have two-deep leadership on any rides in Santa Fe Dam Area.

SCOUT'S OWN - A Scout is Reverent

One of the main points of the **Scout Oath** is **Duty to God**. On Sunday morning, there will be a 15 minute Scout's Own Service at the Check-in/ Campfire Area prior to Breakfast. All Scouts and Scouters are encouraged to attend the services. Dress will be Full Scout Uniform (**Class "A" Uniform**). The Sunday services are non-denominational.

CHECKOUT PROCEDURES

All Units must checkout with registration after final sweep of unit's campsite. Any additional procedures will be announced at Campfire. Any unit leaving camporee early (before Sunday) must indicate at Sign-In Registration AND let Dennis Goble or Bob Huss know BEFORE your unit leaves. **[Attention: LDS Units]**

PLEASE BE ADVISED THAT THIS IS A SCOUTING EVENT AND PROPER ATTIRE (Including footwear) SHOULD BE WORN AT ALL TIMES DURING THE ENTIRE WEEKEND. THE TEN ESSENTIALS ARE HIGHLY RECOMMENDED. BRING NECESSARY CLOTHING FOR CHANGING WEATHER CONDITIONS.

FOR ALL SCOUTS

National Official Scout Field (Class A) Uniform is:

- **BSA tan Troop shirt or forest green Venture shirt**
- **BSA olive green shorts or pants**
- **BSA olive socks or hiking socks**
- **Red or green shoulder tabs**
- **BSA belt (unless belt is included in pants)**

Activity (Class B) Uniform is:

- **Appropriate Troop / Crew T-Shirt**
- **BSA Olive green shorts or pants**
- **BSA Belt with BSA pants (unless belt is included in pants)**
- **BSA Scout socks or hiking socks**



PATROL COMPETITIONS

(Saturday)

All events will be judged for teamwork, leadership, participation, and skill. For the games, the optimum patrol size recommended is 4 to 8 scouts, so it is suggested to use provisional patrols, if desired. Patrols get points for having a patrol flag and the 10 Essentials (especially water bottles & first aid kits.)

BIKE RELAY AND ASSEMBLY

Patrols will assemble part of a bicycle, have it inspected, and ride a designated course.

CANOE RACE

Patrols will be given instructions regarding the canoe event to be held by the boat ramp area, near the Lifeguard Station. No swim test will be required, since we will be in shallow water.

LIFELINE RING TOSS

The boys will demonstrate their skills by tying several knots that are required in the trail to First Class. Be ready for any possible surprise knots used in Pioneering. Teamwork is important to maximize your score in the allotted time.

KIM'S GAME/ BICYCLE PARTS & ACCESSORIES

Bicycle parts and accessories will be displayed on a table and then covered up. In a team effort, items need to be identified. Bonus is given for proper terminology of the bicycle parts.

COMPASS COURSE

The scenario: Your patrol rode bikes in the wilderness through a field filled with thorns. All the bike tires are flat. How will you get back to civilization and have enough water to survive? By using a magnetic compass (or a cell phone compass), your patrol will need to identify certain markers using pacing and orienteering skills.

BIKE RIDE FIRST AID

One of your patrol members encountered a rattlesnake on a bike trail. He swerves and falls off his bike. The type of injury will be disclosed during the event. First Aid supplies will be provided. What will you do???

PONY EXPRESS - PIZZA DELIVERY

The patrol will be given an order to make pizzas & drink and deliver it to their customer. Specific instructions will be given at the time of the event. How good is your patrol at following directions?

GATEWAY AND CAMP INSPECTION COMPETITION

(Please indicate at registration if unit/patrol is a cycling or backpacking unit.) Troop gateways are permitted to enter a contest to be judged. Proper knots and safety are necessary for this. Before building “**towers**”, discuss safety requirements with staff. The general public is not allowed to climb on any towers, due to insurance reasons. Please follow guidelines for campsite inspection check sheet.

Optional Cycling Merit Badge requirement completions

The Cycling merit badge is an optional required Eagle badge. Parts of the badge requirements can be met during or to/from the camporee. Camporee Staff will have a list of cycling merit badge counselors available present and will be on-hand to sign off certain requirements. Scout will be required to contact his counselor to complete the badge. Bring a blue-card. Never bike alone – always have a buddy and have two-deep adult leadership. For best results units should prepare several weeks before the camporee.

Cooking Competitions

Saturday night – May 6



There will be two “90-minute” cooking competitions, one **backpacking** style (from backpacking patrol) and the second, a **traditional** type of cooking, where ice-chests can be used. If you wish to use **dutch ovens, an half hour extra for coals is allowed**. Dutch oven coals must be on a raised surface to protect grass lawns. Your supplies should feed your patrol and provide an extra plate for the judge of the contest. A copy of the menu is to be provided and will be judged on the nutritional content of the food. Notify staff beforehand if you are in these events, so that a judge can be present.

SILVER-SIERRA COOK-OFF

Patrols can enter a Saturday dinner cooking contest, using their favorite **backpack** recipes, which will be inspected by judges for back-country use (no refrigeration required). Backpacking equipment can only be used, and must be provided by the patrol who are in the contest. Contest will be judged on flavor, presentation, nutritious meal, cleanup, safety and teamwork.

GOLDEN-SPOON COOK-OFF COMPETITION

Patrols can enter a Saturday night cooking competition using patrol boxes and ice chests which allows frozen and canned ingredients etc. Patrol provides their own food and equipment. Contest will be judged on flavor, presentation, nutritious meal, cleanup, safety and teamwork.

GUIDELINES FOR CAMPSITE INSPECTIONS

Despite the specificity, some objectivity is still involved. However, this should provide a pathway to a better understanding and more consistent expectations.

Tour Plan & Duty Roster Posted

1. 5 points - Tour Plan posted on Unit's Bulletin Board
2. 5 points - Roster posted showing Scouts by Patrol / PLC and Adult Attendees
3. 5 points - Patrol Duty Roster posted in patrol kitchen showing division of labor for food preparation, cooking, cleanup, fire, water and site inspection
4. 1 point - Documents protected from elements.

Tents Properly Pitched

1. 4 points - Tents arranged in order – smaller tents in front, larger in rear and properly pitched by patrols.
2. 2 points - Guy lines from tent are attached by either a bowline or double half hitch. Taut line hitches are tied to free end around stakes. If rope is used, rope has been whipped on ends. Guy lines on flies have taut-line hitches to tie around trees or tent stakes.
3. 1 point - Guy lines from dining flies or tarps marked with caution tape or other highly visible material where tripping could occur.
4. 3 points - Tents are open (provided weather is good) and personal gear is neat and packed up. If foul weather, tent flaps/windows are closed and securely tied. Only battery powered lights in or near tents.

Fire Safety

1. 5 points - Two or more Class ABC Portable Fire Extinguishers (or equivalent) available and easily seen in unit's kitchen and/or barbecue area.
2. 5 points - Extinguishers tamper seal is in place and inspected within one year.
3. 5 points - Propane tanks in safe location and all valves in off position when not in use.

Flags Properly Displayed

1. 5 points - American Flag displayed on it's right (which is on the left entering gateway.)
2. 5 points - Unit's Flag displayed correctly (which is right of U.S. flag entering gateway.)
3. 5 points - Patrol Flags used at Camporee

Troop First Aid Kit Available

1. 5 points - **Unit First Aid Kit/s** properly identified and readily available.
2. 5 points - First Aid Kit ready for inspection and adequately equipped with bandages/ Band-Aids, latex gloves, alcohol swabs, etc. (medicines not expired.)

Patrol Method Evident (Camp Gadget, Patrol Boxes, etc.)

1. 5 points - Camp Gadget that demonstrates lashings (gateway counts).
2. 5 points - Patrol area neat, free of trash with tents in order, patrol boxes clean.

Patrol Cooking Utensils clean and organized/ Food Storage

1. 5 points - All equipment is clean and put away in patrol box or container
2. 5 points - All food is properly stored away from animals



Scoutmaster's Corner

Buddy system must be followed at all times. Please reinforce this with your unit in the weeks leading up to the Camporee. Patrol Leaders will be responsible for their Patrols during the events, competitions and activities. **During competitions any adults observed instructing, helping, or leading will cause a deduction of points for that competition.** Be sure to bring and apply sun screen, and drink plenty of water.

Forms Please print out the following several pages as needed:

- **Tour & Activity Plan:** Each troop/crew/team/ship must fill out a Tour & Activity plan in order to attend Camporee. This plan must be filled out and applied for 2 weeks prior to the event. Plans must be submitted electronically by going to myscouting.org and selecting the tour plan under your "Unit Tool".
- **Informed Consent Form:** copies must be in the possession of each Scout Leader. At arrival, each troop will provide a copy of the youth and parent roster to be turned into Staff check-in area (this is the payment verification for adults and youth). The scoutmaster then has his own copy of the same roster, and has the corresponding release forms of the youth (25 on roster = 25 Informed Consent forms). This is necessary for leader liability and registration verification.
